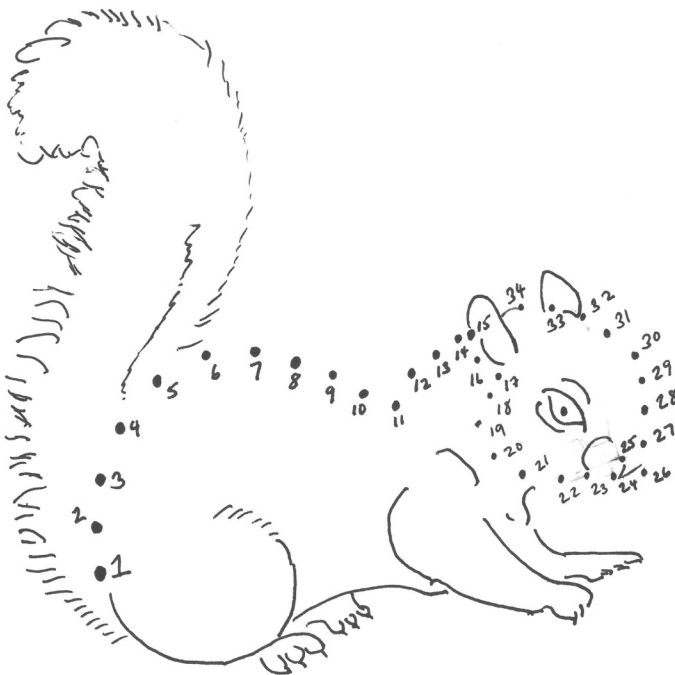

### Two Famous Kentucky Christian Presidents

Two Kentuckians became presidents. Both men were born in the early 1800's. One was born enslaved in Lexington on April 25, 1817. The other was born free in LaRue County on February 12, 1809. He was the person who freed the slaves with the Emancipation Proclamation. One was an African American. The other was white. One was a lawyer. The other was a sugar cane and coffee farmer. One became the sixteenth president of the United States. He served during the Civil War and was murdered on April 15, 1865. The other became the tenth president of Liberia, Africa. He served from 1883-1884. He died in office on April 4, 1884. One was Abraham Lincoln. The other was Alfred F. Russell. Some people say he was the first African American president.

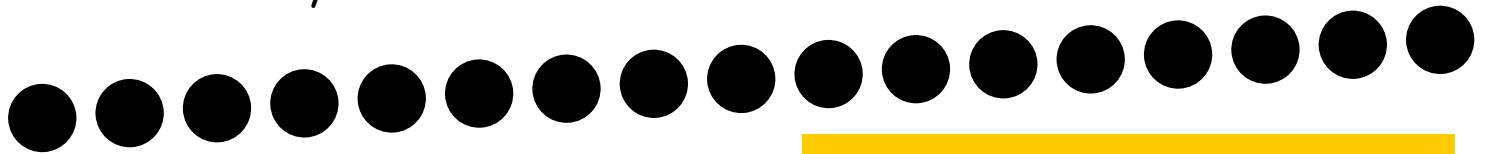
### Dot-to-Dot

He did not want to be the "richest person in the cemetery" so he gave lots of money away, mostly to help churches. Have you tasted his fried chicken and mashed potatoes? If you live in Japan, it is probably what you eat on Christmas. *Kurimasu* is the Japanese word for Christmas. *Kentakki* is the Japanese word for Kentucky.
