

# **Kentucky Poets**









Here are four famous Kentucky poets. A is Albert A. Whitman. He wrote poems about African American life and history. B is Dottie Rambo. She wrote song lyrics for children and adults. C is Jesse Stuart. He lived in Eastern Kentucky and was made the Poet Laureate of Kentucky. A poet laureate is the official poet for a state or nation. D is Effie Waller Smith. She wrote poems about her favorite foods, her faith, and important events in her life.

# Why do people write poems?

Poems are short. Poems usually make really good mind movies because the words are so descriptive. Most poems are supposed to be read out loud. Some poems use rhyming words. Some poems use rhythm. Some use both rhythm and rhyme. Some people write poems to describe a beautiful place. Some people write poems to explain how a strong emotion feels. Some people write poems to share a memory. Some poems tell about an important person or an historic event. Some poems can be put to music. When they are sung, they are called lyrics.

Poems do not have chapters like a book. Instead they have verses. The verses have a certain number of lines. Some lines have a certain number of syllables.

There are so many different types of poem. Limericks are funny short poems. Haikus have just three lines. The first and third lines have exactly five syllables. The second line has exactly seven syllables. A sonnet is a longer type of poem.
